progress.


What does the DES team do?

- Conduct educational testing and determine eligibility for special education services in conjunction with the Department of Psychological Services
- Develop, review, and implement the Individualized Education Program (IEP) plans
- Provide a continuum of service supports to assist students in the general education curriculum in a variety of ways
- Accommodate and Modify Instruction according to IEP needs
- Lead and Facilitate Professional Development related to needs of teachers and students



Services

- Present educational information to students through Specially Designed Instructional support services
- Facilitate parent outreach and educate and support families
- Provide opportunities for student engagement in the community through programs, work training, and athletic and extracurricular assistance
- Offer specialized preschool Special Education Services through a continuum of support
- Review and provide specialized supports for autism, behavior, speech, occupational and physical therapy and many other specialized service areas





If your child receives special education and related services, it is required that he/she has an Individualized Education Program (IEP).



What the IEP Does?

The IEP will address your child's unique abilities and needs and describe how he/she will access the general curriculum.

Describes how your child learns.

Describes how your child best demonstrates what he or she is learning Describes what teachers and service providers will do to help your child learn more effectively.

The Case Manager

A case manager is usually a special education teacher or another member of the IEP team. (This person may be a special education teacher who works directly with your child, but doesn't have to be.)



Makes sure services and supports are being implemented for the student.


Point of Contact

The case manager will keep you informed about your child's progress. He or she is your 1st point of contact in regards to your student's educational experience. Teacher/School Liaison

Case managers also work with all your child's teachers and related service providers to make sure they understand the IEP.



Test Accommodations Change essay to multiple choice No penalties for spelling errors Different test or worksheet Decrease the level of difficulty Decrease number of vocabulary words

Allow use of notes Type on computer Give orally Length shortened Modify grading scale Pacing Extended Time Breaks Vary activity Omit timed assignments Frequent verbal checks for understanding






